# - A Message from Pastor Mark-

"We don't just build community; we rebuild it, and rebuild it, and rebuild it, for as long as we have reason to be together." -M. Scott Peck

As we spend this month commemorating the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Martin Luther's posting of his 95 thesis (points of debate to bring about change in the church), we also grieve the resulting division. In the last 50 years we've made great strides towards reconciling and healing past hurts, seeking to better understand our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters and vice versa. This for me is the very heart of what Christian community is all about. We are called to be agents of reconciliation. This is a difficult venture, because there is no assured way for us to bring about reconciliation. There is nothing that we can do to guarantee it will happen. It always comes as a gift of grace. This remains true between denominations as well as between individuals.

Nonetheless, as followers of Christ who practice forgiveness and participate in God's work of reconciling the world, we strive to continually create a favorable congregational environment for this to occur. Our life together is all about relationships. The strength of our witness depends on our doing everything necessary to seek reconciliation whenever relationships are broken or strained. I hold up two key factors for fostering a positive climate of reconciliation. First, strong bonds of love and support existing among members of our community. Loving one another because God first loves us. Second, being committed to a 'speaking the truth in love' kind of dialogue that doesn't blame, but seeks to understand one's own role and includes a willingness to apologize and forgive.

We are blessed to have many opportunities to connect with one another and form loving and supportive communal bonds that cultivate God's reconciling grace. Sunday mornings include not just worship, but also an opportunity to connect with others at Sunday Circle. Stronger bonds of community are built monthly at our brunch potluck (next one October 1). We also now have 3 midweek Bible Study opportunities for connection and learning. Participation in BUILD, singing in Choir, or serving on our Habitat for Humanity project, strengthens bonds. Serving on our Care and Support Ministry, or on various committees and teams, attending a Sophia Group book discussion or many other activities, all build the communal bonds of love and support, foundational for a community that practices reconciliation.

In the From Conflict to Communion Common Prayer Service on **October 22**, at 7pm, Lutherans and Roman Catholics will pray together 'for the Holy Spirit to prepare us to repent for the dividing walls that we, and our forebears, have built, and equip us for common witness and service in the world.' Plan to participate in multiple activities this month as we commemorate the Reformation jointly with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are Roman Catholic. May this journey of reconciliation and towards greater unity also motivate us to build stronger bonds with one another! Being and becoming a congregation that exhibits the love of Christ, means rebuilding community over and over again! This in and of itself is a powerful witness to the world.

**September was a great month**, filled with learning, exploration, and relief from the heat (at the beginning of the month).




