2014 Indiana Kentucky Synod Assembly Report

From June 5
through June

7, Teri and I represented you and this congregation at the Indiana- Kentucky Synod Assembly.

Although we went with low expectations of droning speakers and rubber chicken dinners, we were most pleasantly surprised to find inspiring speakers, crisp and efficient business sessions, and outstanding worship opportunities.

At the Opening Banquet on Thursday a guest bishop from the Disciples of Christ told us, "The Greater Church is something like Ikea furniture...some assembly is required." We need to gather as a Greater Church to share our stories of how God is working among us.

Our Keynote Speaker for the Assembly was Pastor Melissa Reed of Portland, OR. She told us about Jesus and Lazarus. She told us how death is stinky, and the stink may linger even nowadays after Jesus' resurrection. For us that stink represents the

pressures in our lives: financial, health, or inter-personal issues. However, instead of being life-sucking and private, we should share our stories within the family of God so they can be resurrecting and life-giving by being public and shared.

Pastor Linda Norman, Treasurer of the ELCA, brought a message from our new Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. She told us:

-We are the Church and we need to speak in accessible language using parables and short personal stories.

-We are Lutheran, and as such we are constantly Renewing and Reforming.


-We are Church for the sake of the World. We do this through things like the Malaria Project which has spent over \$11 million to control and prevent this disease. We have provided over \$19 million for World Hunger. We also are on many scenes to provide Disaster Relief.

There is much to be excited about in this Greater Church. Teri and I hope that you, too, can attend the Assembly in the coming years as delegates from our church to share in the Blessings we enjoyed.



In 1998, Janet Severi Bristow
and Victoria Galo, two gradu-
ates of the 1997 Women's
Leadership Institute at The
Hartford Seminary in
Hartford, Connecticut gave

birth to a ministry of Prayer Shawls. Compassion and the love of knitting/crocheting were combined into a prayerful ministry and a spiritual practice which reaches out to those in need of comfort and solace, as well as in celebration and joy. Many blessings are prayed into every stitch.

Prayer shawls become tangible symbols of love when words can't be found to adequately express one's feelings. They can be warm hugs of happiness, empathy and support; a private place of escape in which to rest, relax and renew; something to hold on to when all else seems to be slipping away.

A prayer shawl is usually done in a pattern of a multiple of 3 stitches – to represent Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Upon completion of the prayer shawl a final blessing is offered before the shawl is given away. Members of the Pastoral Care Team at Faith will be presenting the shawls to the receivers.

Leroy Elder, recovery from head injury.



Benefit for Juvenile Restorative Justice

A Taste of Grace celebrates its **fifth** annual event this year!

Proceeds from this year's event will benefit **Juvenile Restorative Justice (JRJ)**, a direct result of BUILD's efforts. JRJ works with Fayette County Family and District Courts, providing victim-offender mediation and case management services for juvenile offenders and their families. JRJ also provides mediation services for Fayette County middle schools and high schools, in response to bullying and other conflicts. JRJ's goal is to remove juvenile offenders from the penal system before they become lifetime offenders, to resolve their underlying problems, and to bring resolution to their victims.

JRJ's intervention has had extremely positive results in keeping many juvenile offenders from further trouble, and counseling and staffing are provided entirely by volunteers. Money is needed, however, to provide transportation for families who otherwise cannot make it to court dates or counseling sessions, to provide groceries for families without enough to eat, to buy program supplies, to provide equipment and supplies for children with special needs, to train staff, and to meet other operational expenses. With this year's benefit we're hoping to help fill that gap, and support the crucial work being done by Juvenile Restorative Justice.

This year's location is the same as last year's (The Ballroom House, Brannon Crossing), and ticket prices are again **\$40 in advance** (soon available from any Parish Life member), or **\$45 at the door**. This year's event also includes a Silent Auction, with exciting items to bid on, and the ever-popular Wall of Wine. Each bottle of wine retails for at least \$25 (in some cases much more), and will be hidden from view. For \$25 select one of the hidden bottles - then see which one you get!

For additional ways to contribute please consider donating items for the Silent Auction, or helping stock the Wall of Wine by either writing a check to Faith with "Wall of Wine" in the memo line, or donating a bottle of wine valued \$25 or more.

If you attended last year's event you know how much fun it was, and if you didn't - don't miss out again! Tickets include heavy appetizers, open bar (beer and wine) - and great entertainment throughout the evening!

Dear friends,

As you begin to enjoy summer in the north, we are getting out our wool sweaters and turning on space heaters to try and stay warm as we head into what is predicted to be a very cold and rainy winter here in Chile.



Sometimes it feels like we go from one emergency to another. On April 12th a raging fire devastated low-income neighborhoods of the hilly port city of Valparaíso, reducing 3000 houses to ashes and leaving 12,000 people homeless. The "Cerro" (hill) Las Cañas was the area hardest hit by the blaze. A community center directed by Mauricio Salazar, a wonderful young man who participated in EPES' Third International Training course, was one of few buildings left standing and has become the hub of emergency response activity. We have been so impressed by the group of young volunteers who all lost their homes but have been tireless as they provide 300 people meals every day, receive, organize and distribute emergency aid to families and organize to confront all the complex issues of reconstruction. The fire revealed the profound underlying inequity and poverty

in the city and especially in the hills. Recovery is going to be a long and complex process. It is a major tragedy and a huge mess.

We are grateful for your support and prayers for our ministry and ask especially for your prayers for these young leaders and the thousands of families that were devastated by fire and now face the very cold and rainy winter in flimsy emergency homes. **We are so grateful for the ELCA and the committed and tireless staff of Global Mission** who faithfully work to help churches and communities around the world respond with relief action in emergency situations but also support and accompany communities and churches in the complex challenge to help build a new and more just social order.
