#### Consecration Sunday Shouldn't Feel Like Tax Day

"Celebration Sunday," "Stewardship Sunday," "Ingathering Sunday," whatever it is called, congregations typically designate a service each fall to receiving financial commitments for the coming year. And Faith Lutheran is no different: this year we will hold "Consecration Sunday" on November 24<sup>th</sup> at both services.

This is an opportunity to give thanks for God's provision, celebrate our ministry together, and pledge our support so that this ministry continues in 2025. This year, the Stewardship committee is also collecting time and talent sheets for the first time in several years. This appropriately recognizes that stewardship is about more than money and that we are called to give in a variety of ways.

Another shift this year is that we want to highlight the joy and celebration that accompanies stewardship. In that vein, both services on November 24<sup>th</sup> will include a celebratory surprise for all who attend worship. It is my hope that we will gather together with a sense of gratitude for all that God does for us, and in turn all the good that God empowers us to do for our neighbors.

The church is a living sign of abundance, generosity, and perseverance. That is particularly true for Lutherans. In an essay entitled "The Catholicity of the Local Congregation," pastor and theologian Timothy Lull opens with a provocative observation: "What is most remarkable about Lutheran parishes in North America is their very existence." From the very beginning, Lutheran immigrant communities on this continent built congregations and church institutions through voluntary giving. Without the tax revenue of the state churches they left behind, and often operating with very little extra, Lutherans built colleges, hospitals, schools and churches from sea to sea. We have inherited this legacy.

Stewardship is ultimately not about budgets, or institutional needs, or burdensome obligations, but rather a natural reflection that all that we have comes from God. At the same time, as someone close to me puts it, "stewardship is hard: it is a sensitive subject and objectively boring." It is the "eat your vegetables and watch your sugar intake" of church life. But as maintaining a healthy body allow one to pursue many life-giving activities, so does the mundane work of stewardship prepare our community to accomplish great things.

And it is good for us to give. Nothing helps a person fend off the temptations of greed like generous giving and faithful service. Recognizing that sharing what we have is good for us helps explain why it so often feels good to give gifts to loved ones or contribute to something that matters. That, I believe, is the true sense of "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:6). Contentment and joy are not the products of "having enough" so much as a reflection of "giving enough."

Let us prayerfully discern our commitments for the coming year and celebrate the fruits of this discernment on November 24<sup>th</sup>!

Faith Lutheran Church, Lexington, KY, is hiring for the position of Facilities Manager. This position is responsible for providing oversight and maintenance of all church facilities and grounds and supervising the Church Sexton, in order to ensure a safe and well-maintained property.

Must be able to problem solve, work independently and be flexible. Hours are 40 per month averaging 10 hours per week. There will be some set hours but this position also requires flexibility and on call availability including snow removal and response to alarms. Hourly rate: \$20-25 range.

Job functions will include:

- -electrical to include lighting and wiring
- -plumbing to include sink and toilet repair/replacement
- -painting

# **Deep Green Faith Forum**



*How do I fit into this world?* That is the question we will be exploring in the new year. Each of us is a unique member of the Body of Christ. We naturally have different gifts and abilities, not to mention lifestyles. How do we integrate faith into our daily lives, to live in such a way that we honor the world that God has made.

Rather than suggesting a list of dos and don'ts to apply universally to our lives, we will be reflecting on what we can do and what we feel called to do. The shepherd David, fighting Goliath will serve as our model. When Saul insisted on preparing David for battle by outfitting the boy with bulky armor, David could not move. Instead, David went to the stream to collect **five smooth stones.** The first one flung from his slingshot killed Goliath. The stones served as David's effective tool for addressing his challenge. We won't have to face such a battle, but what tools might we use to face the challenges of our place in our time? Finding our five smooth stones, or whatever number of stones seems appropriate, is our intention.

This intention will be pursued through the **Deep Green Faith Forum** and grounded in Martin Luther's case for an everyday practical and compassionate response to a Gracious God. We will weave together three different strands for exploration:

- God and Nature
- Vocation and Faith
- **Refuge and Learning**

We will be looking into these three strands more extensively, but let's start with an invitation for you to share your vocation and faith story. Members of our congregation and community will be sharing their stories of how vocation can shape faith and how faith shapes one's vocation. What we do in our everyday lives can be a vital expression of our beliefs.
