Dispatch from Adventide

Although I am occasionally accused of being a grinch or a scrooge, I honestly have nothing against Christmas. It is a beautiful season of the year, full of wonder, beauty and joy. What better service could there be than a candlelight eucharist on Christmas Eve? Christmas is magical! My issue with Christmas, at least the popular version of it, is that it is like a mighty river that has overflown its banks. No matter how important or picturesque that river might be, it completely swamps everything around it.

And nothing gets flooded quite like Advent. I feel this keenly every year: Advent is my favorite season. Even in my own household (from whence several of the accusations of being a "grinch" or "scrooge" come), I find myself in the minority. Bea is adamant that Christmas should begin on December 1, and I suspect that Victoria might just be one of those "Christmas 365" people. As I hastily remove certain radio station presets from our cars (lest "Last Christmas" by Wham! cause me to drive into a ditch), I wonder if it would not be easier to just capitulate to the red and green deluge around me. Perhaps, but I think I will remain a true-blue Adventist for another year. Come Lord Jesus!

A revised gift policy was adopted by the congregational council in October. The council intends that recommendations about use of the gift will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting in January. i. One (1) Pastor (Non Voting ex Officio)

The plan is for the gift committee to make a recommendation ahead of the December council meeting (12/16). As time is short, scheduling the first meeting will begin as soon as a quorum of representatives has been designated.

Volunteers picked up turkeys that were cooked by generous members of our congregation and delivered them to Nathaniel Mission.



Office Closure


The Parish Office will be closed Wednesday, December 25 for the Christmas holiday. We hope everyone has a great holiday.
