Dear Friends,

Seven people at the 11:00 service. Thus began 2025.

With winter weather making it difficult for people to travel in Lexington, we kicked off the year with a couple of cold and snowy Sundays. As a pastor, I try not to be overly concerned about worship attendance from Sunday to Sunday, but one of my goals this year is for our "Average Sunday Attendance" (ASA) to go back above 100. ASA is a useful measuring stick for ministry planning. I am not sure what God thinks about my goal: on the one hand, one's plans often are undone by reality, and on the other, the fact that we held worship at all was a blessing. I guess I will keep planning and praying, and we will see how God directs our steps this year.

I do give credit to the editors of the lectionary: picking Psalm 147 for the second Sunday of Christmas is a smart move. In the middle of winter, we read the psalmist's question, "who can stand against God's cold?" In the context of our recent frigid weather, the answer is obvious: no one. Like many people at Faith, I grew up in a more northern clime and I am familiar with winter weather. Personally, I will take 20 degrees and 4 inches of snow over 95 with 98% humidity any day. But cold does remind us that there are forces far more powerful than we are, that we are creatures within creation, and that our lives, like those of all living things, are fragile. Like a skeleton in the corner of a Baroque painting, winter weather breaks up our routines, offering us a "memento mori." Things get canceled, familiar roads become unpassable, and those who can, hunker down at home.

Thankfully, while we can witness the power of God in and through creation, we also know that God is not cold or distant to us. In Jesus Christ, we have reconciliation and redemption. We are invited in from the cold of separation from God and given a place in God's household forever. This too is alluded to by the psalmist, who in the very next verse reminds us "The Lord send for the word and melts them." The word of God brings the light and warmth of truth into our lives.

May we experience milder weather going forward and be able to rejoice together at worship throughout the year.
